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








Maximum Low Income Threshold By Family Size





Incidence of Low Income from 2011 National Household Survey (LIM AT)














Persons Living in Low Income (LIM AT) By Age and Gender, Edmonton City, 2011 NHS














Child Poverty Rate by Family Type (LIM AT)










Percentage of Children in Poor Families Where One or Both Parents Works Full-Time, Full-Year, Alberta










Percentage of Market Poor Children Lifted Out of Poverty by Government Income Transfers, Alberta








Real Median Income Growth (Edmonton CMA)

Real Median Income Growth (Calgary CMA)





Solutions - Build on What's Working

- Enhance federal child tax benefits
- ➤ Introduce parallel Alberta Child Benefit
- Reward work (increase minimum wage and employment tax credits, implement living wage)
- Increase and index income supports for those who can't work
- >Invest in early childhood learning and intervention
- Support community programs and services that achieve solid results
- ➤ Deliver on 10 Year Homeless Plans





Where the City Can Show Leadership

- Implement Low Income Transit Pass priced at \$35 per month (same price as the existing AISH Monthly Pass)
- ➤ Secure Land Supply for Affordable Housing
 - ➤ Urge the province to amend the Municipal Government Act to require developers to reserve land for non-market Housing in all new neighbourhoods
 - ➤ Designate some Surplus School Sites for non-market housing including permanent supportive housing
- ➤ Implement a living wage for City contracted services. To ensure a person working full-time for the full-year does not live in poverty requires an hourly wage of \$13.00 with benefits and \$14.50 without benefits (based on 2012 data)
