Survey of Edmontonians



Leger

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Methodology

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In June 2014, Leger was contracted by the Edmonton Community Foundation (ECF) to conduct a survey with Edmontonians regarding various aspects of life in Edmonton.

Data Collection

- 401 interviews were conducted with Edmontonians between June 17 and June 18, 2014, on the Internet via secured access to the online questionnaire hosted on Leger's servers.
- Email invitations were sent to residents of Edmonton from Leger's Web Panel inviting respondents to participate in an important study. Emails were embedded with a unique identifier to ensure that each respondent was able to complete the survey only one time.

Target Respondents

- Residents of the City of Edmonton aged 18 years or older

Statistical Reliability

- The survey was completed using Leger's web panel. Panel collection methods conform to The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association's standards and best practices.
- As a non random Internet survey, a margin of error is not reported (margin of error accounts for sampling error). Had these data been collected using a probability sample, the margin of error would have been ± 4.9 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Summary of Findings

Summary of Findings

Life in Edmonton

- Most (67%) Edmontonians state their quality of life is very good/excellent.
- Edmonton is viewed as culturally diverse (90% agree) with many opportunities for sports/recreation (83% agree) but finding affordable housing is not so easy (22% agree it is easy to find affordable housing).
- The majority of Edmontonians feel safe in their homes (90% agree), communities (81% agree), and Edmonton in general (73% agree).

Food Security and Poverty

- Two in five (43%) Edmontonians agree food security is a significant problem in Edmonton. They suggest government policies and programs that reduce poverty/address barriers to healthy eating (32%) as the main priority to improve food security.
- Nearly three-in-five (57%) Edmontonians agree poverty is a significant problem in Edmonton. Opinions are divided on whether there are adequate initiatives in place to reduce poverty (30% disagree, 35% agree).

Transportation

- Edmontonians mainly use cars (73% use as main mode) for their transportation needs, largely as the driver. They perceive Edmonton as a car friendly city (76% easy to get around Edmonton using a car), but feel it is less easy to get around walking (41% easy), using public transit (32% easy) or biking (30% easy).

Summary of Findings

Community Engagement

- Edmontonians acknowledge the importance of involvement in their community (68% agree), and feel they have opportunities to get involved (71% agree). Half (50% agree) state that they make an effort to be involved, and a similar proportion (53% agree) feel a sense of belonging.
- Nearly three-in-five (59%) Edmontonians have volunteered in the past 12 months. Those who have volunteered in the past 12 months did so 17 times on average in the past 12 months. Four-in-five (80%) Edmontonians have donated money to a charity or non-profit organization in the past 12 months.

Youth Challenges and Involvement

- Less than one-in-ten (7%) Edmontonians agree that youth are involved in their communities. Lack of employment opportunities (15%) and drugs/alcohol/smoking (11%) are identified as the biggest challenges facing youth.


Other Topics

- Edmontonians highly value post-secondary education (82% state it is important).
- While the majority of Edmontonians agree (59%) that technology and social media contribute to improved social connections, a sizeable proportion (29%) disagree as well.







Food Security* in Edmonton



*Food security is defined as existing “when all people at all times have access to sufficient, safe, nutritious food to maintain a healthy and active life”. Commonly, the concept of food security is defined as including both physical and economic access to food that meets people’s dietary needs as well as their food preferences. Essentially, people should have sufficient quantities of food available on a consistent basis and enough resources to obtain appropriate foods for a nutritious diet.

“Teach low income families how to shop for and prepare nutritional meals at a reasonable cost.”


“Target school meal programs to where most needed.”

“Promote city gardening programs by supplying adequate, rich earth, water, fertilizer, necessary tools, and instructors.”



Opinions about Poverty



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



Opinions on Ease of Transportation








Volunteering and Charitable/Non-Profit Donations

(in the past 12 months)






Youth Involvement in their Communities

Biggest Challenges Facing Today's Youth







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Q15. What do you think are the biggest challenges facing today's youth in Edmonton?
