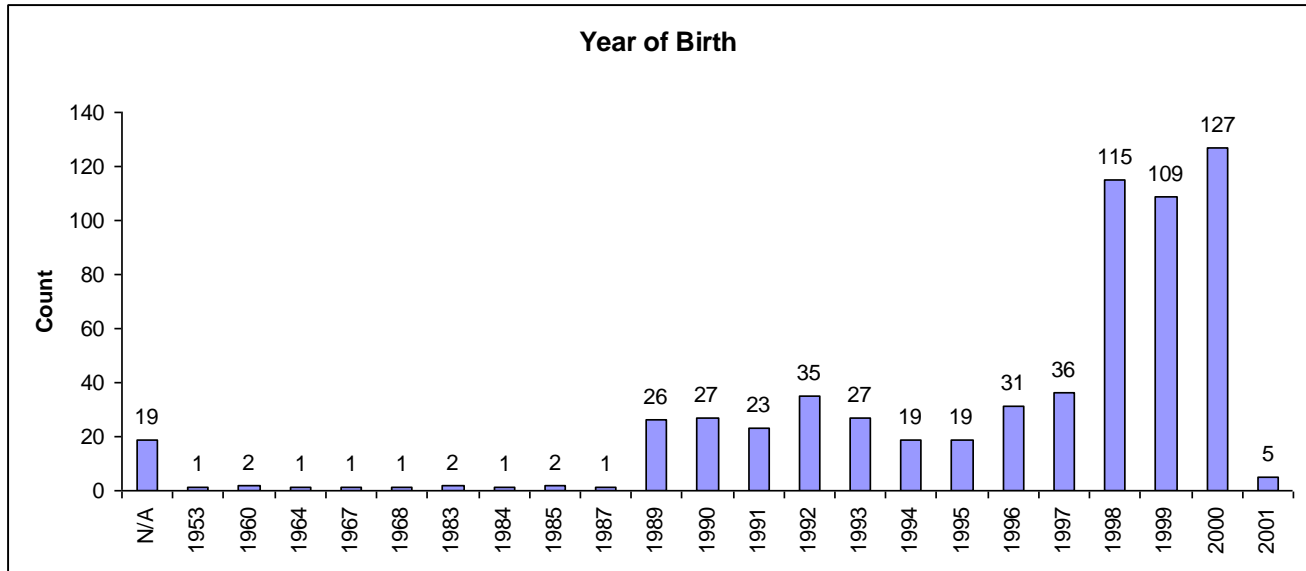
The purpose of this survey is to understand how youth feel and what their attitudes are towards our city and their communities.

Q1 What year were you born?

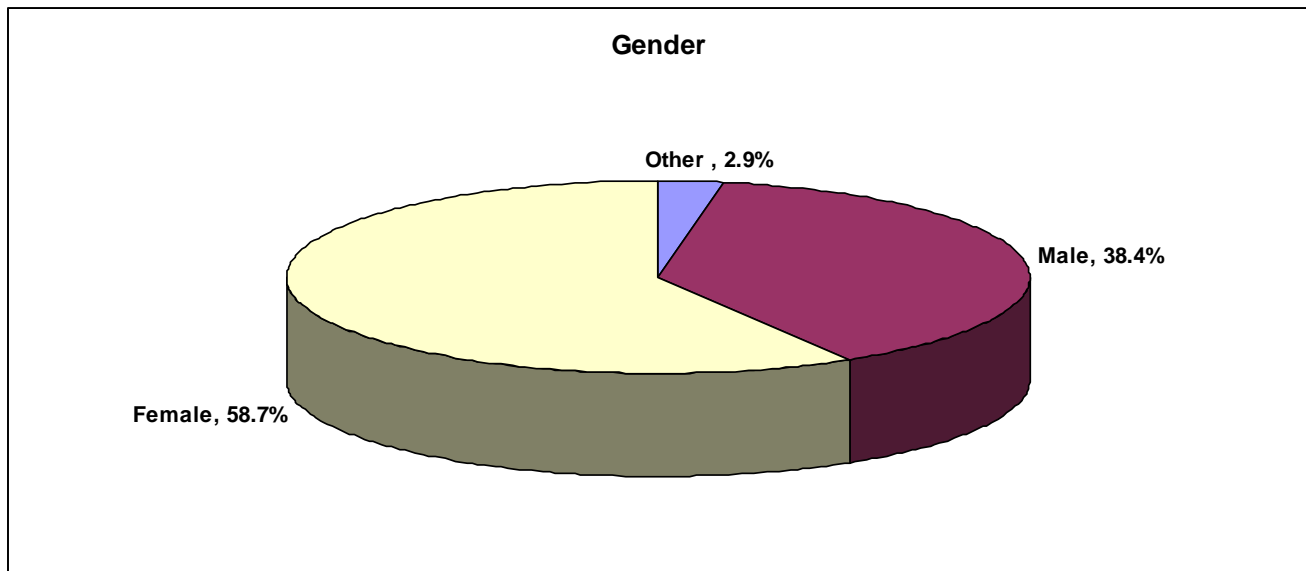

Q2 What is your gender?

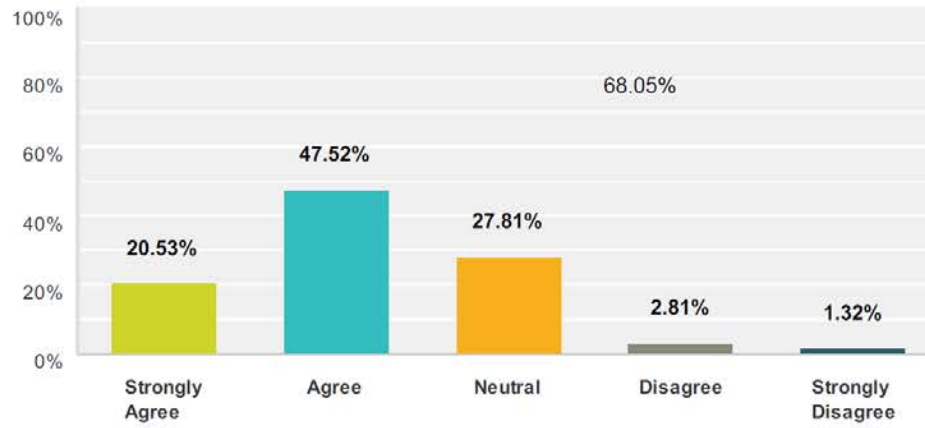

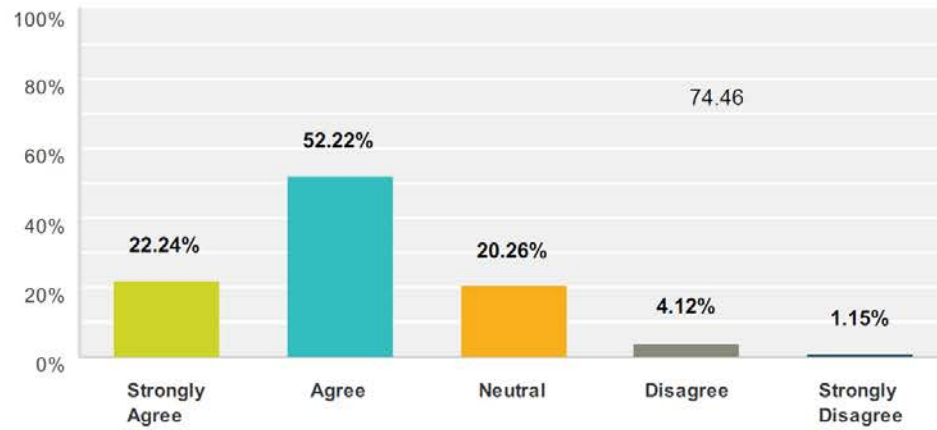

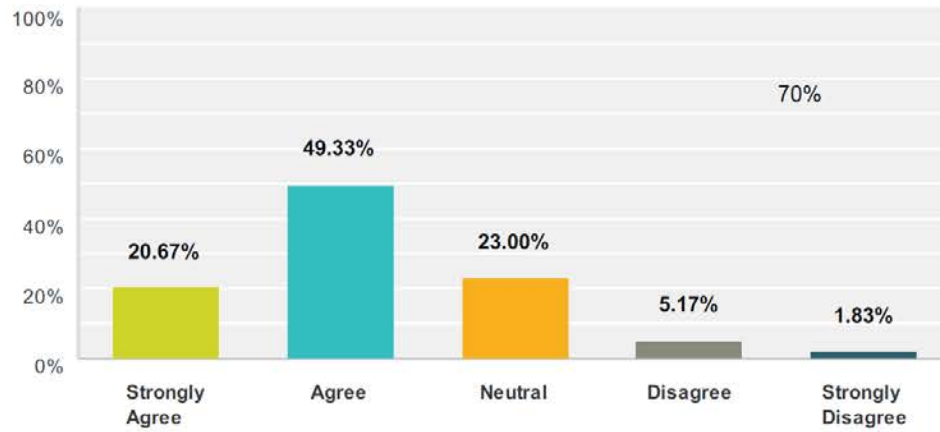

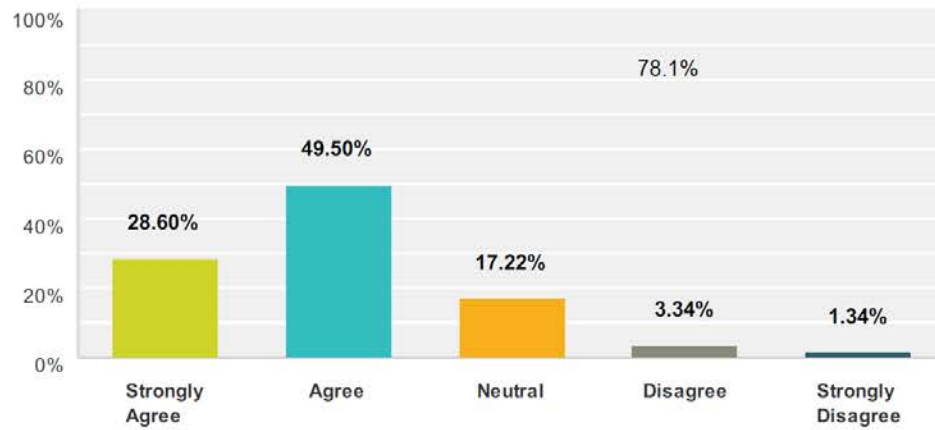

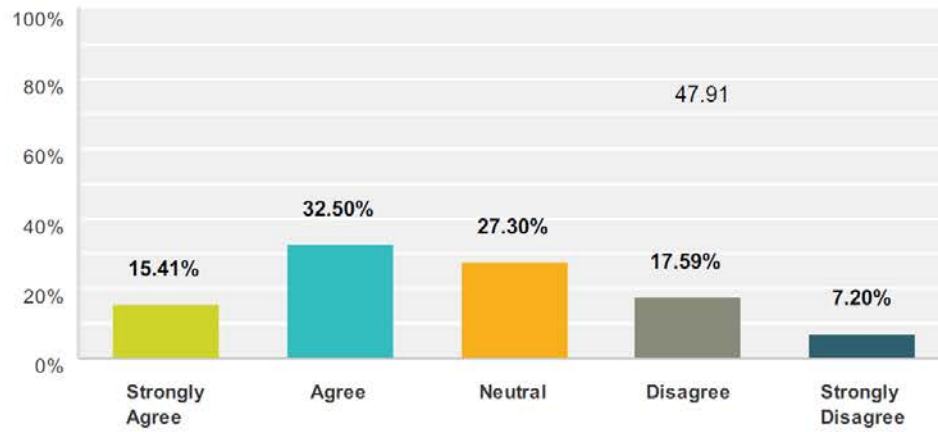

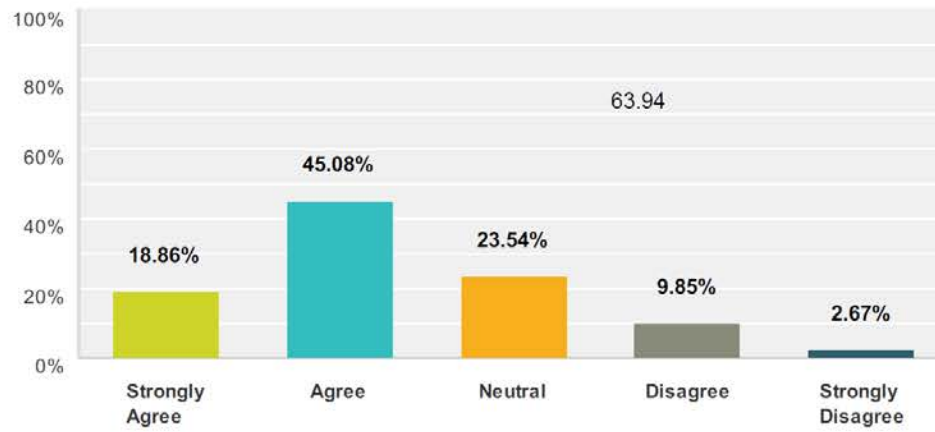

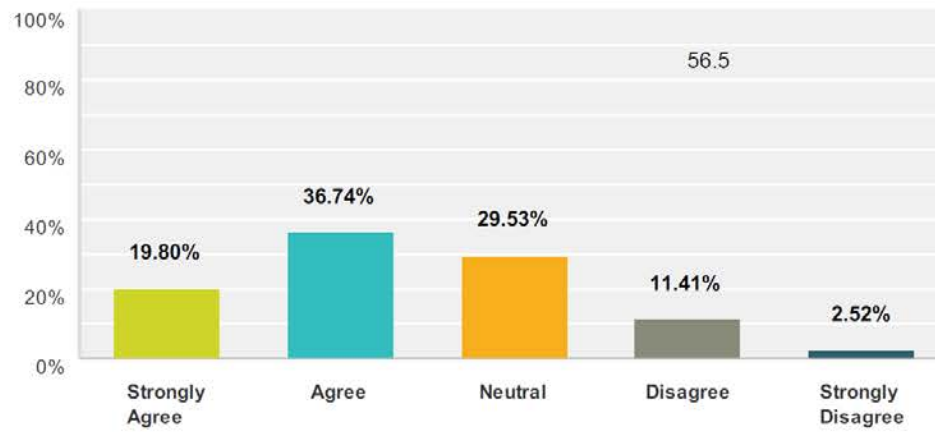

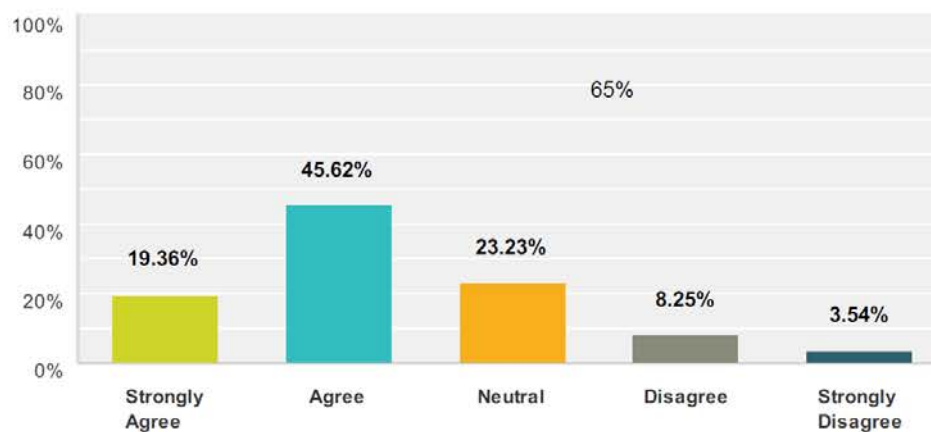

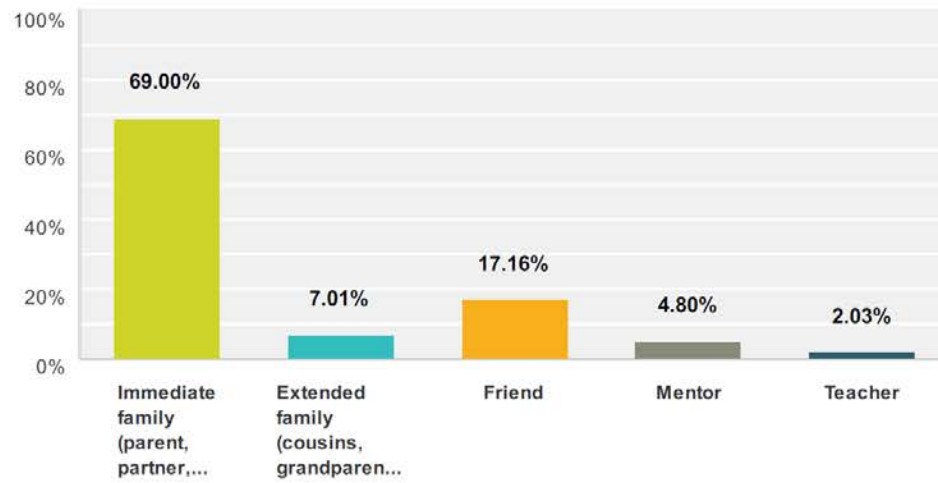

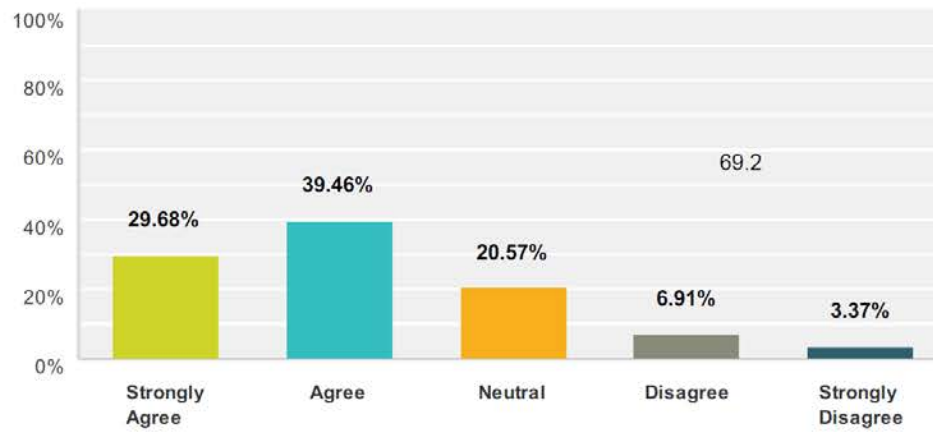

For example, while inner city youth require more resources, suburban youth often feel that they are overlooked by the municipality in social affairs, like providing adequate public transportation, reducing class sizes (esp. in primary school), and planning for present and future financial stability.
