Attended by 80 Edmontonians representing all sectors.

What They Said:

- Barriers to multiculturalism and to social inclusion exist in communities.
- These barriers also exist in institutions: the family, public institutions (libraries, police, hospitals, schools, government), religious institutions, political organizations, for profit and not for profit organizations.
- Media feeds racial stereotypes, is preoccupied with violence, and conglomerates serve the political interests of owners.

What They Recommended:

- Community networks working for multiculturalism
- Government

Anti-racism and cross-cultural education of all people in all sectors.

Evaluation of current policies. Incorporate diversity and multiculturalism in business plans, and allocate resources on an ongoing basis.

A Diversity Task Force in Edmonton, similar to the one in Calgary.

Schools

encouragement of parental involvement all teachers trained in anti-racism and cultural awareness curriculum in schools and post-secondary inclusive of diversity and emphasizing multiculturalism

• Media

More positive reporting of racial minorities and cultural sensitivity, stop negative stereotyping
